### IV. Assessment Practices

- Review of some of the discussion on 11/14 regarding holding back assessments
- Change in practice has been implemented: assessments will now be handed back for students to keep.
  - Does not include midyear and final exams
  - AP courses still a question because materials may be from embargoed tests
  - Some discussion about whether it should be a policy in the Student Handbook. Perhaps we pilot it for a year without an official policy.
  - A teacher expressed surprise that it is still an issue if it's understood that it's best for students to access their assessments for learning.
  - Another teacher talked about the impact on test integrity
  - Another teacher talked about having to make changes in English classes
  - Some discussion around changing the numbers for skill-based assessments and ascertaining how much students genuinely understand versus what they might have just memorized to include in a question.
  - A parent raised the suggestion of making assessments universally accessible, for purposes of equity.
  - Suggestions around other ways to help students, e.g., student internships as teaching assistants, a BHS tutoring center

- A student suggested teachers previewing questions so that it is clear exactly what will be on the test
- A parent suggested that the change should be formalized in some way to make sure it doesn't happen again.
- Principal Galante noted that we will return to this conversation in February or March to consider

#### V. Cell Phone Grant

- There will be a teacher-led committee
  - Teachers will receive a stipend
  - Research articles to share
  - Draft a plan to pilot cell phone expectations
  - Draft a letter to parents/caregivers
  - Share plan with faculty
  - Reconvene the committee after pilot

  - A student supported this work
  - A parent raised the question of a strict policy without taking the phones
  - A student shared that some teachers take them from grade 9 students and not from grade 12 students, suggesting that perhaps the seniors would benefit from that same restriction
  - Another student shared their experience in different classes, raising the question of developmentally appropriate expectations based on age.
  - A teacher talked about the need to shift school culture around phones and digital citizenship in general.
  - Another student revisited differences in expectations based on age
  - The principal acknowledged the developmental element, while noting that phones are unequivocally a distraction. We teach digital citizenship in grade 10, wonder what learning happens earlier.

■ A teacher raised the question of parents/caregivers' role in these expectations, as they provide the devices and may not support these expectations - for example, in the event of an active shooter
