II. Grading Practices

- Current work of the BHS Instructional Leadership Team
- Teachers have read passages from Feldman's *Grading for Equity*
 - No plan to institutionally implement standards-based grading
- Interested in looking at two major areas
 - **■** Consistent Grading Practices
 - Assessment Calendar
- Discussion
 - Inconsistency around whether students get to keep tests once they are graded
 - Some teachers allow students to access tests but they must remain in the classroom, e.g., in a folder
 - From a parent's point of view, that practice was maddening. Why can I not look at this work and help my child learn the material?
 - A student suggested that perhaps quizzes should be handed back.

- A teacher explained some history and context of why assessments have been held in the classroom (the challenge of creating multiple, equivalent versions of quizzes/tests; protection of AP problems; historical problems with students cheating on quizzes/tests)
- Another student: it's helpful to be able to look over the work on my own time
- Equity issues for both teachers and students
- What is overall best for students?
- For next time: sense of urgency around minimizing multiple assessments on the same day
 - Eye toward a possible policy change in the Handbook
